It is given that the KHC OSA Colombo was formed very much earlier than our UK Branch; they celebrated their Golden Anniversary on 04 March 1995.

The Columbian Orator, D. Everett in 1797 said:

"Large streams from little fountains flow,

Mighty oaks from little acorns grow."

In 1992, the young sapling from the little acorn started to grow and now stands mighty tall as a well- established organisation celebrating its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year in 2017. The OSA's achievement of UK Charity Status in 2004 was one of the major milestones in its 25 year history and would go a long way to help the association meet its future objectives.


